

RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS
Minutes of Rossford Special City Council Meeting
Held April 2, 2018

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Neil Mackinnon followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL: Staczek, Oberdorf, Eckel, Marquette, Ruse, Heban, and Densic all present.

ORDINANCES

#2018-21 – AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE AWARD OF A CONTRACT FOR THE URBAN PAVING I AND II PROGRAM; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. SECOND READING

Mr. Oberdorf moved and Mr. Heban seconded the motion to read by title only. All ayes. Motion carried. Mr. Ruse made a comment about the lane configuration in the project now saying the school is investigating a possible additional lane which the cost of the extra paving and curbs would require reimbursement from the school. Mayor Mackinnon said this is being worked on. Mr. Marquette asked if this is a curb cut and Mr. Ruse said no, it would be a new lane alignment with a possible third lane or turn lane. Mr. Densic said the base bid is \$1.5M and we pay 20% of that plus cost of additional curbing we add and we need to keep an eye on that additional cost. Mr. Ruse said we would be able to competitive bid the additional curbing. Mr. Densic maintaining traffic through the downtown will be important for downtown businesses. Mrs. Eckel wondered if this project would have a long time span and Mr. Ruse said there has been no conversation on that subject yet but should go quickly as there is nothing unusual being done. Mr. Densic suggested designating alternative parking areas for downtown. Mayor Mackinnon said the construction workers will be parked off site hopefully behind the Methodist church and the rec center. Mr. Marquette asked what criteria were used to decide what curbs to replace. Mr. Ruse said the general condition will be the deciding factor but have not discussed what stays and what goes based on the reveal. Mr. Marquette said this would be the time to look at and discuss angle parking in front of the high school. Mayor Mackinnon said we will work with the planning commission, the schools, and ODOT. Mr. Staczek wanted to make sure the curbs were maximum height so when we repave the curbs don't get lower. Mr. Ruse said a better job needs to be done of grinding pavement down by the curbs so as not to lose the curb reveal. He said angle parking was discouraged by the public works committee as did not add many additional spaces and while it is convenient to pull into it is difficult to see backing out. Mrs. Eckel moved and Mr. Oberdorf seconded the motion to suspend with the third reading. Audience comments were requested and none received. Vote on the motion all ayes. Motion carried. Mrs. Eckel moved and Mr. Ruse seconded the motion to declare an emergency. All ayes. Motion carried. Mrs. Eckel moved and Mr. Oberdorf seconded the motion to adopt. All ayes. Motion carried.

Mr. Staczek moved and Mr. Oberdorf seconded the motion to adjourn. All ayes. Motion carried.
